ABSTRACT

Authors are invited to submit electronically their abstracts, through the Conference web site, before **March 29, 2015**. Abstracts should outline the main features, results and conclusions as well as their general significance, and contain relevant references.

The abstract should be written following the Latex and Word macros that can be found in the Instruction for Authors area on: <http://x-dms2015.sciencesconf.org/resource/page/id/9>. The file must be converted to Portable Document Format (PDF) before submission through the Conference web site. Other formats are not accepted by the system. Note that, to correctly format the abstract, in the provided Word template file each kind of paragraph has a predefined X-DMS style.

The abstract must contain the full name and full address of author/s. In the case of joint authorships, the name of the author who will actually present the paper at the Conference should be indicated with an asterisk. Papers can only be accepted on the understanding that they will be presented at the Conference.




Figure 1: Delamination in a pull-out test on an FRP-reinforced concrete block.

The abstract must be written in English within a printing box of 16 cm x 23 cm, justified and using 12pt Times New Roman. Figures and Tables can be included. They must be numbered consecutively and captioned, according to the examples provided below. The references must

be quoted in the text by numbers [1, 2] and grouped together at the end of the abstract in the numerical order as shown in these instructions. The abstract including figures, tables and references must not exceed 2 pages. Maximum file size is 4 MB.
